American Sign Language is the third most studied and used language in the United States. Vincennes University is offering a unique opportunity for your high school students to take college credit courses in American Sign Language I & II.

Dual Credit: With the approval of your school district, these classes will count towards a student's high school language requirement while doubling as college language credit. Upon graduation, high students can easily enroll into the Vincennes University ASL & Deaf Studies Program to pursue an Associates degree.

Students may take the classes online or at the VU ASL Program located on the campus of the Indiana School for the Deaf – 1200 East 42<sup>nd</sup> Street, Indianapolis, IN 46205.

Classes are offered during the Fall, Spring, and Summer sessions.

Each course is 4 credit hours. Tuition is billed directly to the student or guardian.
